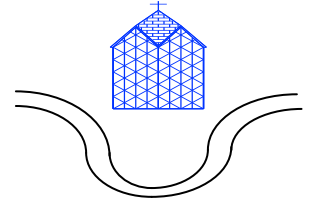

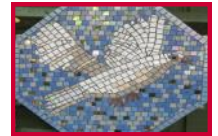

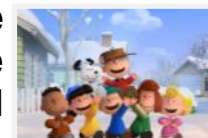
"At the cinema I had so much fun! The movie was a bit scary and sad but in the end it was happy. I think everyone should watch the Jungle Book".
