

#### Literacy

Our topics for the next half term are:

reading and writing fiction, in particular texts linked to Water: adventure stories and poetry.

We will be studying the book Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo.

In terms of grammar, we will be working on expanded noun phrases, semicolons,



colons and dashes, bullet points, and layout devices to structure text.

#### **Numeracy**

In Numeracy we will be revising the 4 operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

We will work on solving problems involving these operations.

We will also be focusing on fractions, decimals and percentages, always applying our skills in order to solve maths problems. In addition we will be developing our mental



maths skills through: chanting and practising all our times table facts, and the division facts that go with them, counting in various jumps from different numbers, and testing our mental maths agility using games and weekly tests.

# **Topic—WATER WORLD**

Come Autumn term & it's time to leave the security of dry land behind for a while. The room is blue, white & red with waves & water adorning each surface; it is full of artefacts designed by man to control, survive in and make use of their watery environments; snorkels & nets, boats & fishing rods, seagulls and sharks. In the corner there's a beach tent & some fish that have been caught in a fishing net! This term we examine marine environments & what happens when man

come into contact with the sea.

Water washes over & soaks into everything that we learn about. We read adventure stories set at sea

& information texts about life in the oceans. Science & English collide when we write explanations of the water cycle & persuasive texts to encourage greater personal responsibility in caring for the worlds marine resources. We also learn about flood, drought and water pollution. Another big area we will work on is 'rivers'. We will learn why they are important as well as researching the major rivers of the world.

#### RE

Our RE theme for this term is: Buddhism. We will be learning about how Buddhists live their lives through their faith. How the teachings of Buddhism are arranged through the eight-fold path, four noble truths, symbols and five precepts.

Children will learn about the sangha (Buddhist community) and Dharma (ultimate truth).

#### PΕ

This year, we are lucky to have professional coaches teaching PE. They will cover all areas of the curriculum throughout the year. Please ensure your child brings in their full PE kit on THURSDAY!
