

#### Literacy

In Reception this term we are learning about the topic People Who Help Us. We will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction texts. We will be finding out information about the police, ambulance, fire fighters, doctors, vets, teachers and many more using lpads and books. Some of the stories we will be reading are written by the teaching staff and are about a range of people.



### **Mathematics**

In Mathematics we are starting the year with length, we will then concentrate on numbers 1-20 and beyond. Children will be ordering, counting and finding the numbers. We will be using books to help us with our learning in mathematics too! The children will begin to learn the names of 3D shapes and will be encouraged to look for shapes in the environment.

### Read, Write, Inc.

Most children in Reception will now be starting the RWI programme. This is fantastic as this will teach them the letter sounds so that they are able to start reading. Therefore reading with your child at home or learning the sounds with your child at home will enable them to read. Those children who are not quite ready for RWI are being taught the skills to help them be ready by next half term.

## Other areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum

We will be covering all areas of the curriculum through our topic about People Who Help Us. There will be many visitors coming into visit the children to inspire them with their learning and give them ideas of what they want to be when they are older and how they can help others.



#### RE

Our RE theme for this term is Bible stories from the Old testament. We will start by learning how God created our wonderful world, hear the story of Noah's Ark, Jonah and the big fish and many more. We will also be learning about Harvest, Diwali, Black history month and the nativity story.
