PE and Sports Premium Impact Report

This is a report to evaluate the impact of PE and Sports Premium. The government has allocated Sports Premium funds to schools which is ring fenced and must be spent on improving PE and Sport in schools. Excellent sports participation improves the health and wellbeing of our pupils. It encourages healthy eating and a healthy lifestyle and improves physical strength and flexibility. It also helps to improve team work and social skills as well as emotional intelligence and self-confidence. The funds should be spent to show impact in the following ways.
