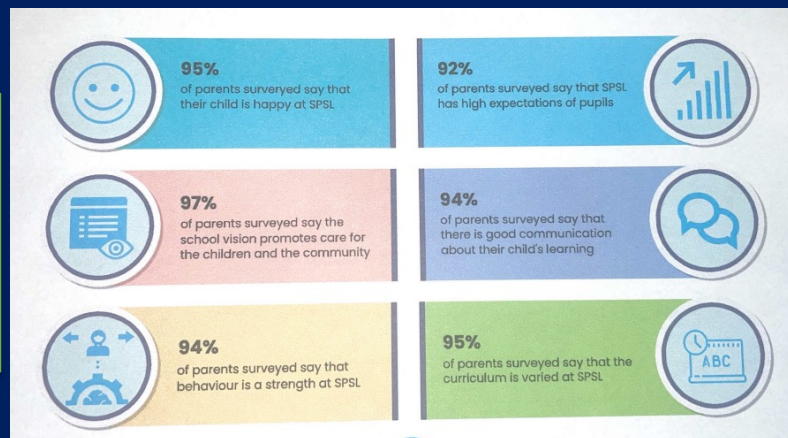
Children from Y5 and Y6 attended the Mile End Adventure centre this week and took part in various climbing activities – a fun time was had by all!

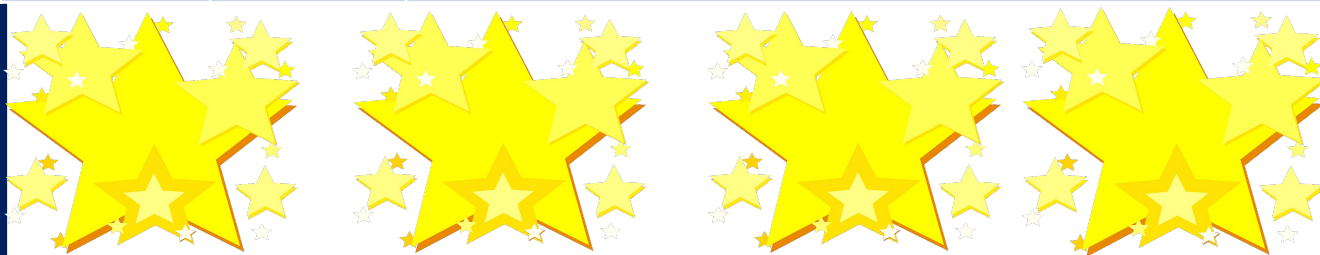

Genesis 8:22

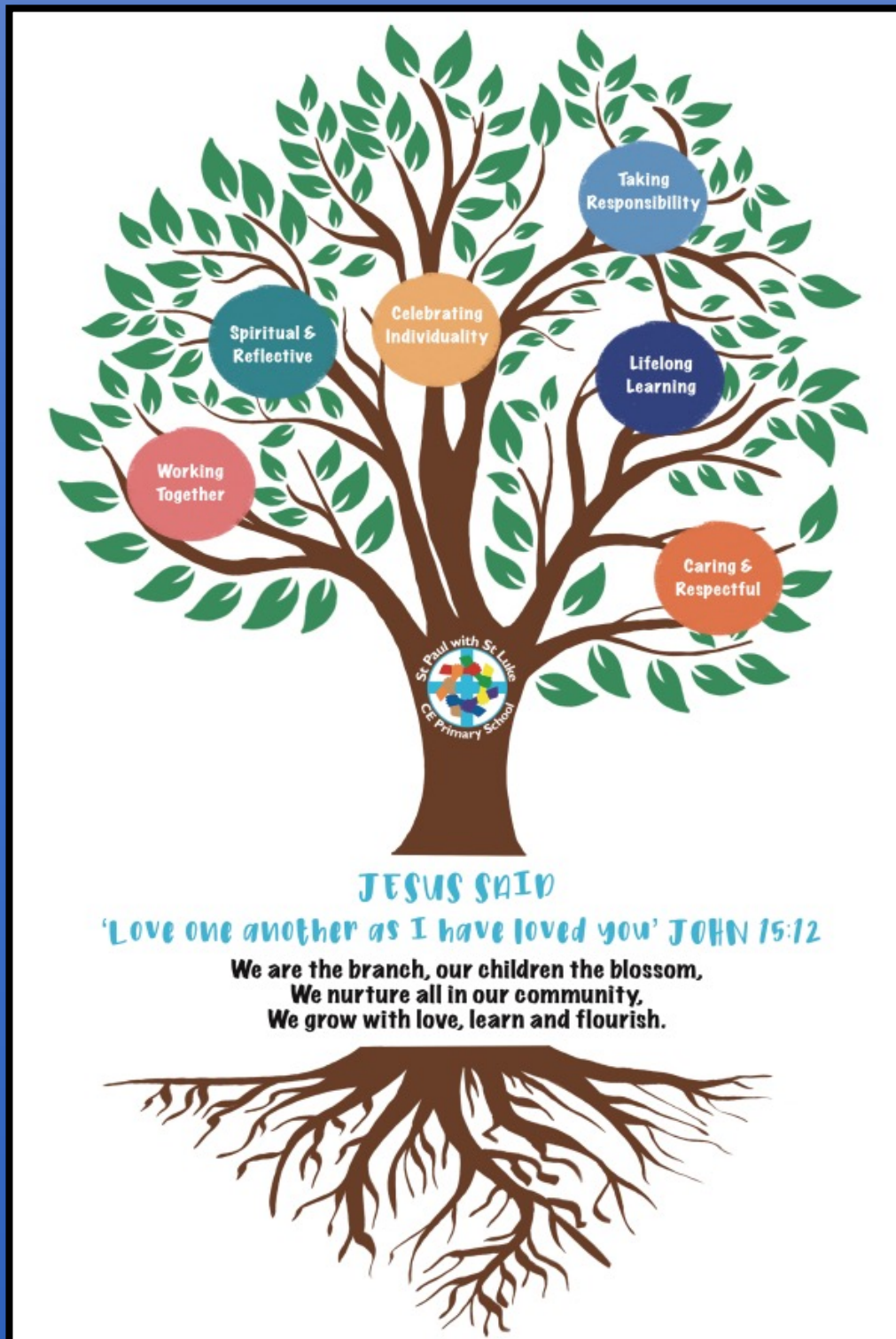


Prayer
