In Nursery we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework. Our Curriculum in EYFS is responsive to our children's needs and interests.



Area's of learning

There are 7 areas of learning and development these are:

- * Communication and language
- * Personal, social and emotional development
 - * Literacy
 - * Mathematics
 - * Understanding the World
 - * expressive arts and design

Children access these areas in a range of ways including singing, role play, drawing and painting, climbing, running, cutting, sticking, investigating water, sand and the natural world, playing with small world toys such as farm animals and train sets.

Characteristics of Effective Learning

The characteristics of effective teaching and learning are central to our curriculum activities. Theses are:

- * Playing & Exploring (engagement)
 - * Active Learning (Motivation)
- * Creating & Creative Thinking (thinking)





Literacy

We will be reading a range of books both fiction, non fiction and poetry. We will be exploring different aspects of the books through reading, writing, art and role-play activities. This term we will look closely at 'The Family Book' and 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

This term the children will be working on recognising their names. We will be encouraging them to find their name when they arrive to self register and to hang their belongings on their pegs before they choose an activity.

In Phonics we are learning all about listening in our environment as well as learning rhymes and musical rhythms. The children will also e introduced to Makaton sign language which helps develop language.

Mathematics

We will be using our Core Books to help us with our learning in mathematics. Children will be



counting and sorting objects and using this as an opportunity to see how many they have altogether. The children will begin to learn about 2D shapes and will be encouraged to look for shapes in the environment.



Religious Education

This term we will be celebrating 'What makes people special?' and 'What is Christmas?'



Whatever The Weather Walks

Children in Nursery will go on regular walks in the local areas to explore different green spaces.



Reading

Please ensure you read to your child every day and are talking to the about the pictures, about what is happening in the story and what might happen next, about how characters feel, and what they like or dislike about the stories they hear. Don't forget to sig up to our EYFS library so you can borrow a new book everyday!

Maths with Parents

Please ensure you log on to maths with parents and complete the activities with your child at home. Children find the activities really fun and it helps support their learning in school.

Tapestry Journals

You will have received your log in for the Tapestry Online Journal where you will see photos and videos of your child's learning. Remember to check this regularly and discuss what you se with your child. Also don't forget to upload your own photos and videos at least once at week.

Encouraging independence

Please make sure you are encouraging your child to be independent by asking them to dress themselves everyday, do up their own coat zip or buttons and feed themselves.
